## Pastoral Letter from Rev A Kimmitt

November 2020

Dear Friends

So it finally happened! After months of lockdown waiting, the arrangements have worked out and now I'm delighted to be in post as the new minister for Aberlour Parish Church. It's been a funny few weeks trying to get settled in and get to know a new community in the conditions we're all living through, but everyone I've met so far has been exceptionally kind and open-hearted and I'm very thankful to everyone who has made our transition a joyful thing indeed. It wasn't necessarily deliberate to move from a riverside to another riverside – but while I'll sing the merits of North Fife's Tay for some time yet, I'm very quickly falling in love with the Spey!

You will hear more (too much, possibly!) from me in the coming months and years, but just now I want to be very clear about one aspect of who I am as a minister. I deeply believe that the minister is not just for 'church folk' – in fact, the Church is not just for 'church folk': so if there's any way I can be of help to you, or within the community, please do reach out and get in touch with me.

Everything is more difficult in Covid-times, and so while I'm trying to make contact with people and groups it might be some time before I get a chance to meet you properly – but I'm very happy when people reach out to me as well. If you recognise me out and about, don't hesitate to stop me and say "hi"!

Church has been different since before Easter now. It will likely be very different until well after next Easter. That is the cost of keeping ourselves and our communities safe, and it is right that we prioritise safety. However, I'm pleased to say that the Kirk Session have decided to open our building for worship in the near future. As I'm writing this in mid-November, our hope is that we'll be open for worship from 29<sup>th</sup> November – in Craigellachie at 9.45am and Aberlour at 11.15am. Services will not be 'normal': they'll be shorter, and we won't be able to sing together; we'll have to limit numbers according to the capacity of the building; it might be chilly because of having doors and windows open to increase ventilation; we won't be able to shake hands, hug or kiss; and we'll be seated 2metres away from other households; there'll be hand gel, and face-coverings, and one-way systems – but it will be worship in-person all the same. Not everyone will feel com-

fortable with this, and I can assure you that I'll be continuing online digital services at <http://aberlour.video/services> for everyone to access. These digital services will be as close to identical to the in-person services as is possible.

And then there's Christmas! I can't say that when I dreamt of my first Christmas as a minister in my own place that I'd imagine it would look this way! I know all of us are struggling with the idea of Covid-Christmas and what that might mean. Some folk are saying 'Christmas is cancelled'; others have bemoaned being told to prepare for a 'digital-Christmas' by health experts. For others, Christmas is already a difficult enough time without the added pressures of this year. I have huge sympathy for folk who will struggle with Christmas this year, but I also take a lot of hope from the resilience I see in communities to face struggles together; to find safe ways of doing *some form* of celebration.

It won't be the same, but whatever happens, Christmas is not cancelled! How could it be? At the heart of the Christmas story is a teenage mum-to-be, travelling to an unfamiliar town, and refused a place to stay until having to settle for a byre with the animals. Even covid-times can't be worse than that! The miracle of Christmas is that in *that* place God was born a human, and from the filth of a manger a baby looked out whose love would change the world. The beginning of John's gospel puts it this way:

"in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it."

These days we can name plenty of 'darknesses' in our world – and I don't think hiding from that fact, or pretending it isn't true is helpful. But darkness is never the final word. In some ways our present difficulties just accentuate the truth that underpins it all anyway: God has reached out to humanity; God has embraced us; God has become one of us; and the darkness has forever been overcome. They say a candle shines brightest in the darkest of nights: in Christmas we have much more than a candle flame, we have the promise of a God who loves us infinitely and eternally. May you know the warmth of God's love this Christmas.

### **Rothes to Craigellachie Multi-use Path**

In July of this year, several members of the path sub-group of Rothes Council held an outdoor meeting and decided to take the project forward with a core group of 4 members, Don Vass, Ronnie MacDonald, Pat Flynn and Ian Douglas from Moray Council, who is helping in an advisory capacity. These members now communicate through email, text and video calls, and report back regularly to the main group.

We decided that an appropriate name for the multi-use path is **The Rothes Way**. We hope to have a website up and running in the next few weeks, which will keep everyone in the community up to date with the progress.

We have submitted an application to OSCR to become a charity registered under the name **Rothes Way Association**, as we felt that it would be more effective to operate in this way rather than as a sub-group of the Rothes Council. Unfortunately, as the Council are not meeting at present, we felt that we would not be able to make decisions on their behalf without their approval which would delay progress. Covid again!

Our aim is to build the path between Rothes and Craigellachie to the standard of the upgraded Speyside Way, and we have obtained initial estimates from experienced contractors for the construction work. However, while obtaining estimates, the project was given a MASSIVE boost, as G&A, which is part of The Forsyth Group, have offered to do the first mile of the path free of charge.

Keith Kingham will be heading up a team of volunteers to assist with maintenance of the path and we hope that he can count on local help with strimming and cutting back verges etc. Up until now, Keith has been doing this on his own plus strimming up the Dounie at Rothes. However, as maintaining the Rothes Way will be a bigger undertaking, it is now time for him to get some help. The dates of any planned maintenance will be posted on Face Book and the website. On behalf of the village, Craigellachie Village Council laid a wreath at the Craigellachie War Memorial on Sunday 8 November in memory of those who lost their lives fighting for their country.

As mentioned in previous Kirk News editions, the Craigellachie Village Council has provided support to residents throughout the current Covid19 pandemic. The work of our community volunteers has been recognised by the Lord Lieutenant of Banffshire and a copy of his letter can be viewed on the noticeboard outside the village hall. We continue to offer support to the community and encourage anyone in need of assistance with shopping, collecting prescriptions etc to contact us.

We recently submitted a funding application to "Scotland Loves Local". This funding is aimed at communities wishing to deliver projects to promote their local area, including making small scale local place-based improvements. We have opted to replace existing worn seating in the village, install some new seats, and plant more trees in the village. One of the conditions of the grant is that it involves working with the community. Therefore, if we are successful, we will be appealing for assistance to help plant the trees and install the seating.

In addition to installing new equipment, ongoing maintenance of existing village amenities is required and we would be really grateful for more offers of assistance to help us out. We already have a couple of volunteers who have offered their skills and time, but there is always work for more people to lend a hand and share the load. if you are able to help us with any of the following tasks:

- scrape and sweep the moss from the tennis courts
- removing leaves, twigs and moss from the tennis courts
- trimming the overhanging branches from the trees at the tennis courts and footpath
- repairing the wooden boards surrounding the bark surfaces at the play equipment next to the tennis courts
- strimming the grass on the steps leading from Spey Road down to the Fiddich Park
- assistance to erect the Christmas tree lights around the village on the morning of Saturday 12 December

FOCB recently received funding from Action Earth to purchase a wheelchair friendly picnic bench and spring flowering bulbs. The picnic bench is presently in storage for the winter and will be installed in the spring. In early November, the pupils and staff of Craigellachie Primary School helped us to plant native bluebell, snowdrop and daffodil bulbs. It is hoped that over the next few years a carpet of bluebells will form amongst the trees beside the wastewater treatment works, while a drift of snowdrops will establish on the other side of the access road to the Telford Bridge. The daffodils were planted in the grass adjacent to the carpark.
